### A note on Sandy & Morse Points

Most people refer to this whole area as "Sandy Point." However, the Sandy Point area is composed of two sand spits, the original (northern) Sandy Point, and a newer sand spit called Morse Point (the larger southern spit). Morse Point has grown over the last 30 years from sand swept off Morse Beach and other beaches to the west of the Sandy Point area.
